


# Nebraska Trivia 2

3. It took three tries for Nebraska to construct this building that would last. The third try took 10 years to build.
4. Lincoln’s longest-running restaurant.
7. Least populated county (465 people) according to 2019 statistics.
11. Garden park that has three main gardens in Lincoln: the Healing Garden, where all the plants bloom white; the Perennial Garden; and the Annual Garden. In the Annual Garden, more than
